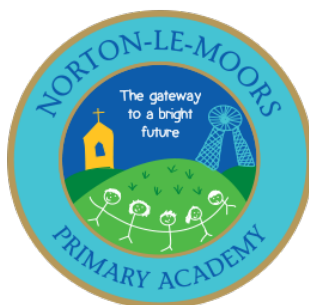

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Statement of intent

The Inspirational Learning Academies Trust believes that in order to facilitate a suitable environment for education, acceptable behaviour must be displayed in all aspects of school life.

We are committed to:

- Promoting positive behaviour.
- Promoting self-esteem, self-discipline, and positive relationships based on mutual respect.
- Ensuring equality and fairness of treatment for all.
- Encouraging and rewarding good behaviour.
- Challenging and sanctioning unacceptable behaviour.
- Providing a safe environment free from disruption, violence, discrimination, bullying and any form of harassment.
- Encouraging a positive relationship between the school and parents.
- Developing appropriate relationships with our pupils which ensure early intervention is possible.
- A shared approach which involves pupils in the implementation of the school's policy and associated procedures.

Promoting a culture of praise and encouragement in which all pupils can achieve.

General conduct

Pupils will be expected to:

- Be polite to all members of the school community and to all visitors to the school.
- Promote an inclusive and tolerant environment.
- Report any incidents of bullying or sexual harassment to a member of staff.
- Always be ready to offer help and support to others.
- Move around the school in a quiet and orderly manner.
- Wear the school uniform correctly at all times.
- Attend all lessons and other school activities punctually.
- Accept the school's sanctions in line with the Behaviour Policy.
- Take pride in the school environment and keep it tidy.
- Not bring to school any prohibited items, including drugs, alcohol, cigarettes and knives, in line with the school's Searching, Screening and Confiscation Policy.
- Not swear or use offensive language.
- Not engage in gambling or games of chance.
- Show consideration for school property and the property of others.
- Adhere to this code of conduct any time they are representing the school, including when wearing uniform off the premises.

Classroom behaviour

Pupils will always try their best in the classroom and ask for help when needed. Classwork and homework must be completed on time. Pupils must not:

- Be disrespectful, argumentative, rude, confrontational or intimidating.
- Lie or answer back to teachers.
- Disrupt a class or make it difficult for others to learn.
- Leave the classroom or school premises without permission.
- Disobey a reasonable request from a teacher.

Attendance and punctuality

All pupils will be expected to arrive at school on time and be present for morning registration. All absences will need to be authorised. Pupils arriving late should report to the school office and sign in.

Regarding any pupils who are considered by the school to be persistently absent, regular meetings to discuss school engagement and support will be arranged with the parents to work towards improving attendance.

Pupils will remain on school premises unless they have been granted permission by a member of staff, with parental consent where appropriate, to leave.

Illness whilst at school

If pupils are involved in an accident or feel ill during the school day, parents will be informed and the necessary arrangements between home and school will be made. Calpol can be administered in school from the school stock with parents permission.

Relationships

Relationships and their appropriateness are taught through the Relationships and Sex Education curriculum. The school has a policy for this.

Appearance

The school's Uniform Policy is to be followed at all times. All pupils are supplied with parts of the uniform that have the school logo on including book bags and rucksacks. The school prospectus has full details of the uniform expectation.

Stud earrings can be worn but not hoops or dangling earrings for safety reasons. Children can participate in all PE activity wearing earrings but parents allow this at their child's own risk.

Mobile technology

Mobile phones are to be switched off when on school premises and may only be used with the permission of a member of staff. Any misuse of mobile phones may result in their confiscation. All mobile phones are stored throughout the day safely in a box away from all pupils.

Monitoring and review

This code of conduct will be reviewed on an annual basis by the headteacher, and any changes made will be communicated to all pupils and staff at the school.
